PINE VIEW PRIMARY SCHOOL'S TARGETS

OnEntry Targets:

- 60% of PP students will be at or above the PP On-Entry standard in Numeracy and Literacy
- 50% of Year 1 students will be at or above Year 1 On-Entry standard in Numeracy and Literacy
- 50% of Year 2 students will be at or above Year 2 On-Entry standard in Numeracy and Literacy

NAPLAN Targets:

- 10% of students in Year 3 and 5 will be in the top two bands in Writing, Reading and Numeracy with the exception of Year 5 Numeracy where 10% of students will be at or above Band 6
- 50% of Year 3 students will be at or above Band 4 in Writing, Reading and Numeracy.
- 40% of Year 3 students will be at or above Band 4 in Numeracy
- 30% of Year 5 students will be at or above Band 5 in Writing
- 50% of Year 5 students will be at or above Band 5 in Reading

Attendance Targets:

- The regular attendance rates for students is at or above WA Public Schools
- Student achievement to be at or above mean scale score in PAT assessments

Play



Play is important for learning and development.

Pine View Primary School will provide play based learning through hands-on opportunities to construct knowledge, develop personal skills and cooperate with others.

Through play students are interested and connected to what they are doing, learn through copying others, have freedom to explore their own interests and answer questions for themselves, learn at their own pace, learn to talk to and interact with adults and other children, develop their imagination and develop resilience.



At Pine View Primary School we provide opportunities for PLAY-based learning for Students by:

- allowing students to express their individuality
- providing a range of resources that encourage students to imagine and explore
- providing access to both indoor and outdoor learning environments
- engage with the natural environment
- making sufficient space for active and quiet zones
- providing equipment to support individual education plans and to encourage independence

At Pine View Primary School Staff incorporate PLAY-based learning by:

- ensuring that professional learning is accessed to support play based learning
- catering for purposeful play opportunities in teaching and learning plans
- sharing best practice around play-based learning across the phases of learning
- focusing on the emotional, organisational and instructional aspects of teaching
- planning experiences linked to the curriculum based on our knowledge of the students and allow sufficient time for purposeful play to occur

At Pine View Primary School our School Community will be engaged in PLAY by:

- accessing classrooms to develop an understanding of purposeful play-based learning
- being encouraged to attend whole school activities that demonstrate purposeful learning through play
- supporting acquisition of play-based resources via the P&C fundraising

Inspire

At Pine View Primary School we INSPIRE students by:

- providing opportunities to inspire students to learn
- providing students with the opportunity to engage in the Auslan language
- providing students access to specialist visual arts, physical education, Auslan and education support programs
- providing opportunities for students to participate in STEAM experiences
- providing students with a learning environment that is safe, caring, inclusive and culturally responsive
- Providing learning opportunities that engage with local Aboriginal knowledge and culture
- making learning meaningful through challenging and achievable goals
- differentiating the curriculum to cater for the learning needs of students
- designing questions to stimulate students' thinking

At Pine View Primary School we INSPIRE staff by:

- providing professional learning opportunities linked to our Business Plan and the Department of Education priorities
- developing an inclusive culture that supports collaboration, teamwork and respect
- Providing up-to-date resources with the relevant professional support
- participating in Auslan lessons provided by Access WA

At Pine View Primary School we INSPIRE our school Community by:

- communicating / sharing events and interesting teaching and learning programs
- promoting special events
- promoting programs in surrounding schools and within the extended Baldivis community
- sharing inspiring student learning with local media

Nurture

At Pine View Primary School we NURTURE successful students:


- by implementing whole school consistent teaching & learning strategies including differentiated learning opportunities, explicit teaching with modelled, guided & independent practice, warms and plenaries, PINE-CONE lesson design & using assessment to inform planning.
- through the implementation of consistent Literacy & Numeracy practices including Talk 4 Writing, Letters and Sounds, research based intervention programs for students at risk
- by building & maintaining a positive school culture based on Six Kinds of Best & building relationships between year levels through faction activities, good standing rewards & special events; providing pastoral care; common approach to behaviour management built on promoting positive behaviours; explicit teaching of social & emotional skills including self-regulation & protective behaviours.
- by making connections with families to promote the success of all students, including those from ATSI backgrounds.

At Pine View Primary School we NURTURE our staff:

- through regular professional learning for all staff including using staff meetings and PD days to provide PL connected to our Business Plan, operational plans & school policies and programs
- via coaching, mentoring & performance management
- through provision of leadership opportunities including learning area leadership, phase of learning & acting positions (as they become available)
- via collaborative practices including team days, collaboration time, disseminate information via Virtue View, formulation of whole school policies & procedures
- building a positive staff culture by respecting others, having an inclusive school, holding whole staff social events.
- by using the ACSF to establish an awareness around the teaching and learning of Aboriginal students

At Pine View Primary School we NURTURE our school community:

- through strong governance with parent, community and staff representation on the School Board.
- through parent communication using Skoolbag, social media, the school website & formal and informal parent interviews.
- by providing opportunities for parent involvement and participation including regular classroom activities and whole activities / events including parent involvement
- by building professional and community partnerships with private therapists for students with special needs, Pine View PS P&C, Camp Australia, universities (pre service programs), YouthCare Chaplaincy Services, local government and non government primary and high schools and local business.
- By building staff awareness of and confidence in implementing the ACSF

Nurturing offers a range of opportunities for students to engage with experiences that give them the social and emotional skills to do well at school and with peers, to develop their resilience and their capacity to deal more confidently with the trials and tribulations of life, for life.



Explore

At Pine View Primary School students will EXPLORE by:

- being provided with the opportunity to become active participants in their own learning by participating in STEAM.
- having the opportunity in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Maths) to ask questions, work together, think creatively, solve problems, explore, take calculated risks, test solutions and discover new ways of performing something.
- find opportunities for integrating Aboriginal knowledge and culture across the learning areas e.g. Two-way Science
- being given time to 'explore' on their own and together with others
- participating in sustainability learning experiences and "Being Kind to the Environment" (6 Kinds of Best)
- being provided with the opportunity to develop questioning skills to expand knowledge

At Pine View Primary School staff will EXPLORE by:

- participating in professional learning in areas of STEAM
- participate in collaborative planning to develop whole school approaches and a whole school culture
- having the opportunity to network with colleagues
- develop staff knowledge on integrating Aboriginal knowledge and skills across the curriculum.

At Pine View Primary School our School Community will EXPLORE by:

- being invited to participate in STEAM activities and whole school events
- accessing information re teaching and learning programs and school events via Skoolbag, Pine View PS website and Facebook posts
- visiting classrooms and having conversations with staff to discover the opportunities that are provided to their children.
